

Theatre series to open with 'A Taste of Honey'

University Theatre's Studio Series will open the second semester with "A Taste of Honey" to be presented in Bryan Hall Little Theatre Feb. 19, 20, 21, 27, and 28 and March 1.

"A Taste of Honey" was written by British playwright Shelagh Delaney when she was 18 years old, and has been praised by critics in England and America for its sensitive portrayal of the three main characters - Jo, a young girl pregnant with her first child; Geoff, the gentle homosexual boy who takes care of Jo; and Helen, Jo's tough and ruthless mother.

The play is directed by graduate student Vernon Poe, and the cast is composed of experienced student actors. It includes Cathi Clary of Nebraska as Jo, Michael D. Rogers of Port Orchard as Geoff, and Gail Carmichael of Bellevue as Helen.

Jeffrey E. Carrol of Indiana plays Jo's sailor boy friend and Brian F. Harshman of Pullman is Helen's latest husband.

"A Taste of Honey" begins as Jo watches her mother leave with Peter, Helen's latest husband. Neither of them can be bothered with a gawky 17-year old girl and she finds some comfort in a brief affair with a sailor who promises her that he will be back someday.

He is gone though when she finds that she is pregnant, Geoff, the homosexual, become her first real friend and takes care of her when she is sick helping her through the lonely, frightening months of her pregnancy.

An exhibit of woodcuts and etchings by Irving Amen will be on display for the next three weeks in the Student Lounge of the CUB.

Amen was born in New York City in 1918 and has exhibited in all major national and international group exhibitions in the

United States and in Europe, Asia and Africa.

Amen's works portray his sensitivity to the relationship between the individual and his overpowering world.

His more mature works are less bitter and blunt, but the feeling of human vulnerability

exists.

Technical skill has been hidden in his figures dramatizing human frailty and compassion by muted colors accented by burning acid notes.


